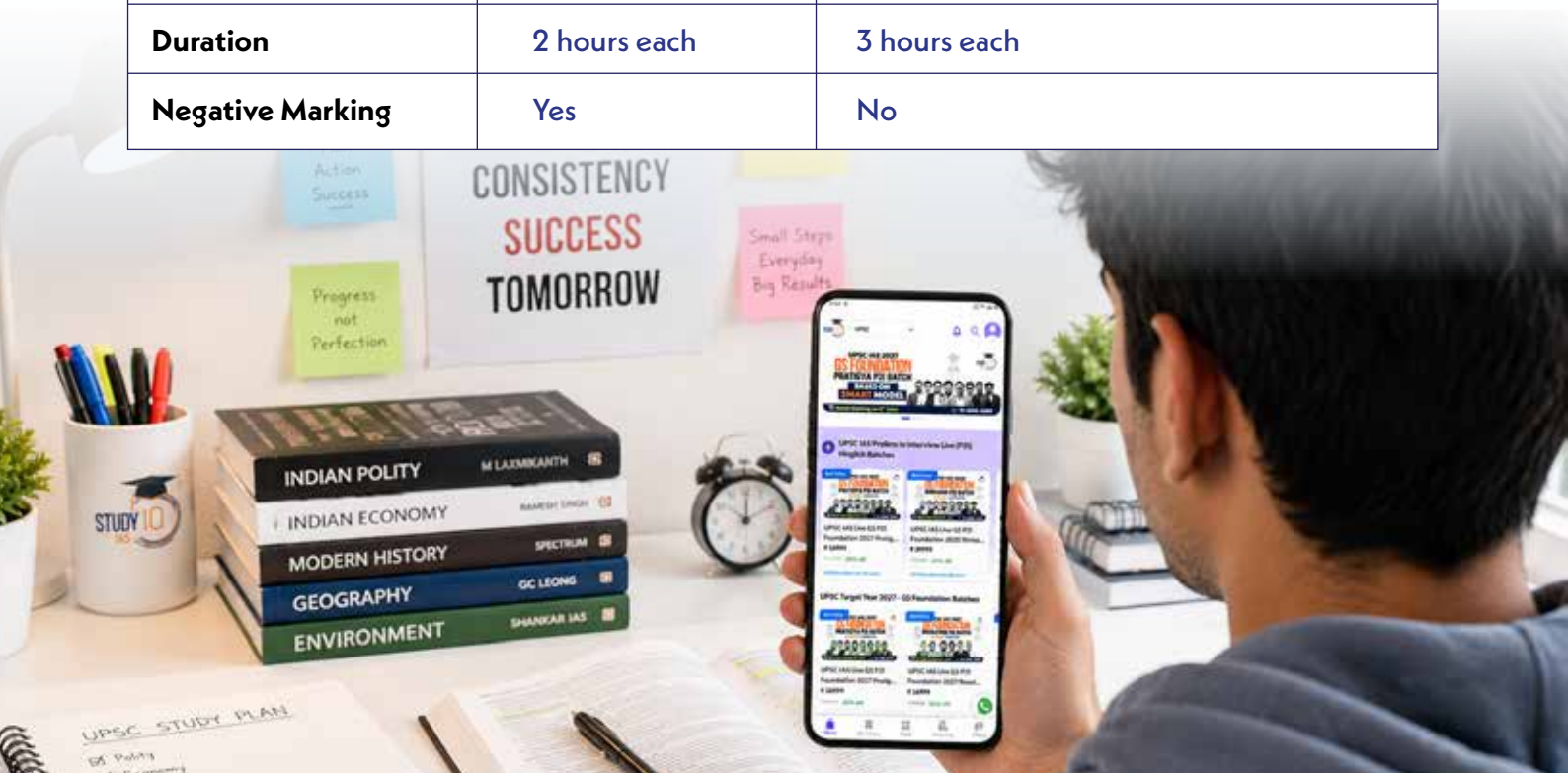

THE PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION CONSISTS OF TWO PAPERS



Paper 1: General Studies

This paper tests awareness and understanding of subjects like History, Geography, Polity, Economy, Environment, Science, and Current Affairs.



Paper 2: CSAT

This paper examines aptitude-related skills such as comprehension, reasoning, analytical ability, and decision-making.

The Prelims stage mainly serves as a **qualifying filter** to shortlist candidates for the Mains Examination.

PERSONALITY TEST

After clearing the Mains, candidates are called for the Personality Test, commonly known as the Interview. This is the final stage of the examination process and carries **275 marks**.

The Interview is not just a test of knowledge. It is meant to assess whether the candidate possesses the right personality traits needed in civil services.
