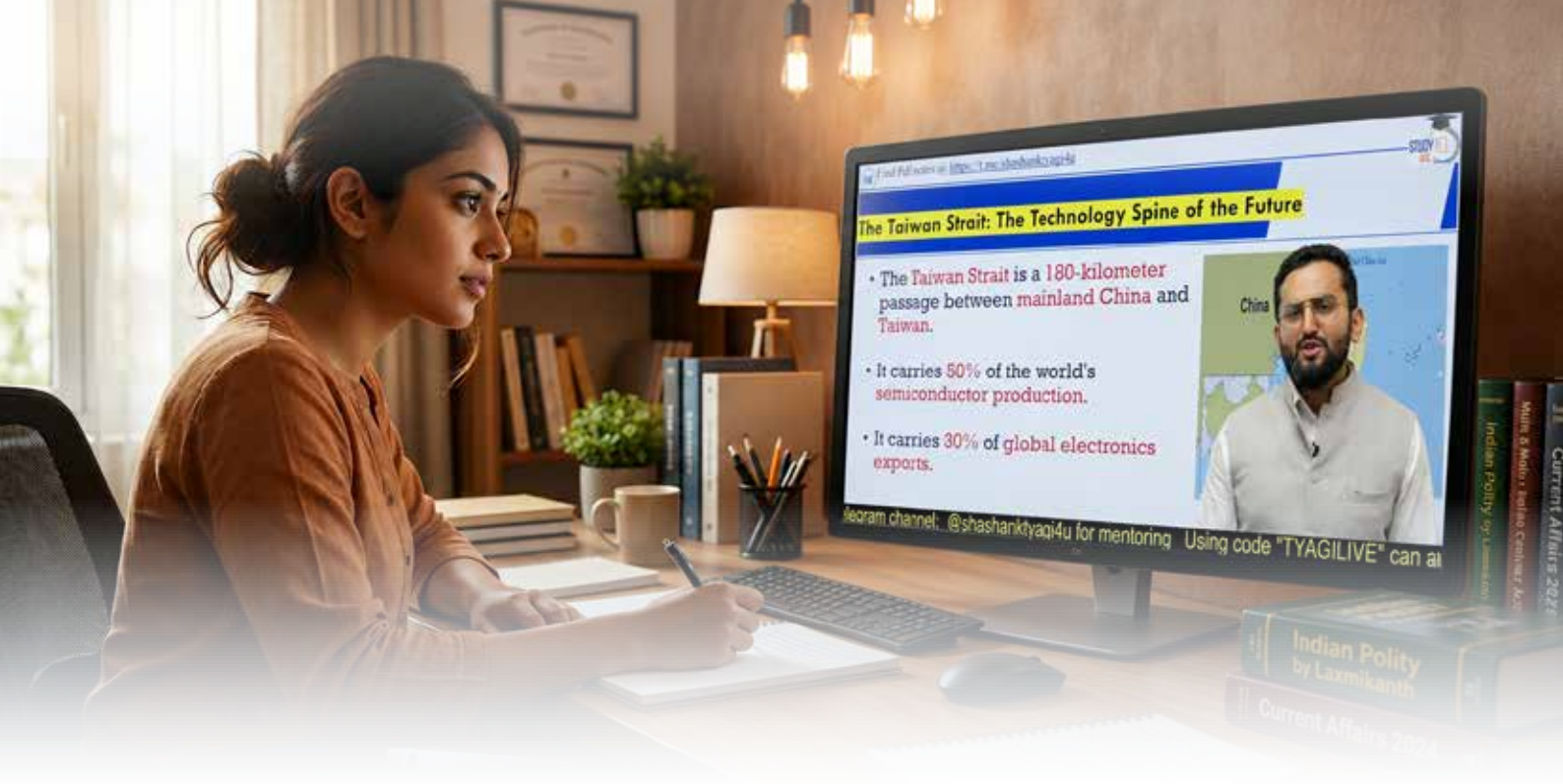

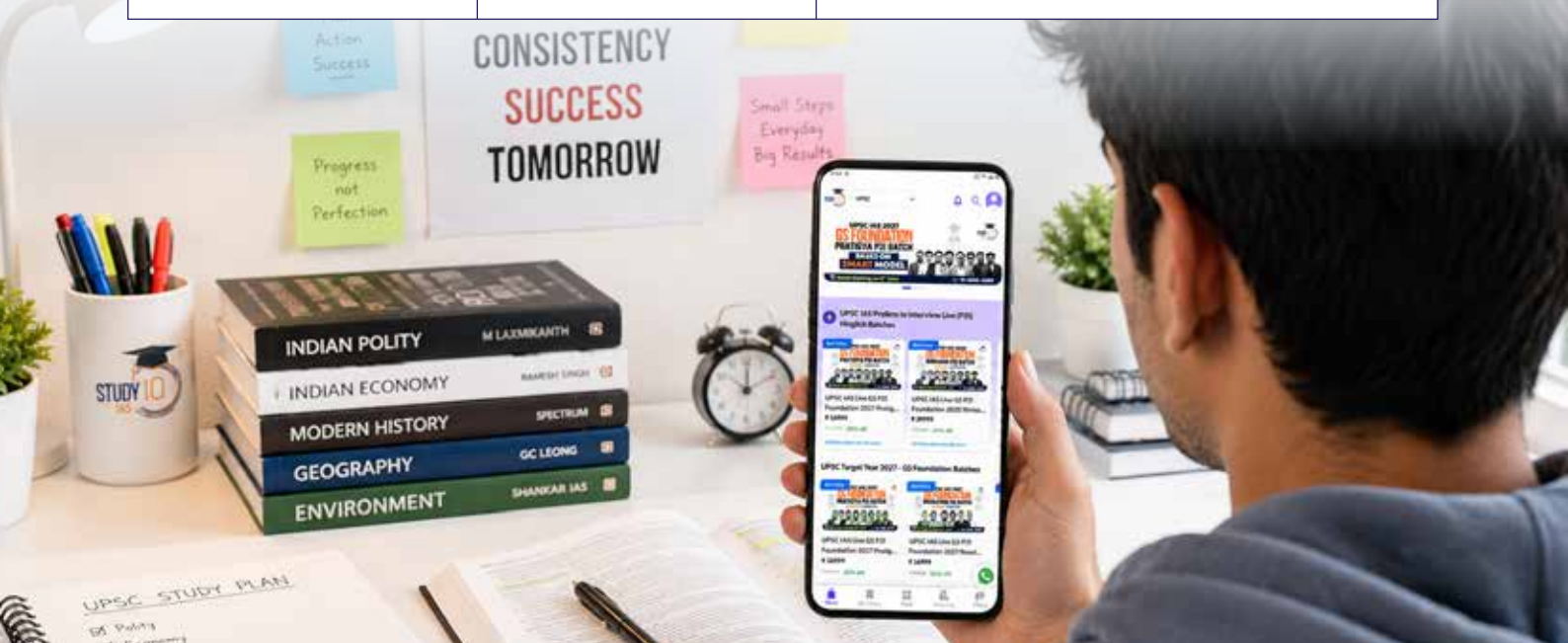

This paper tests awareness and understanding of subjects like History, Geography, Polity, Economy, Environment, Science, and Current Affairs.



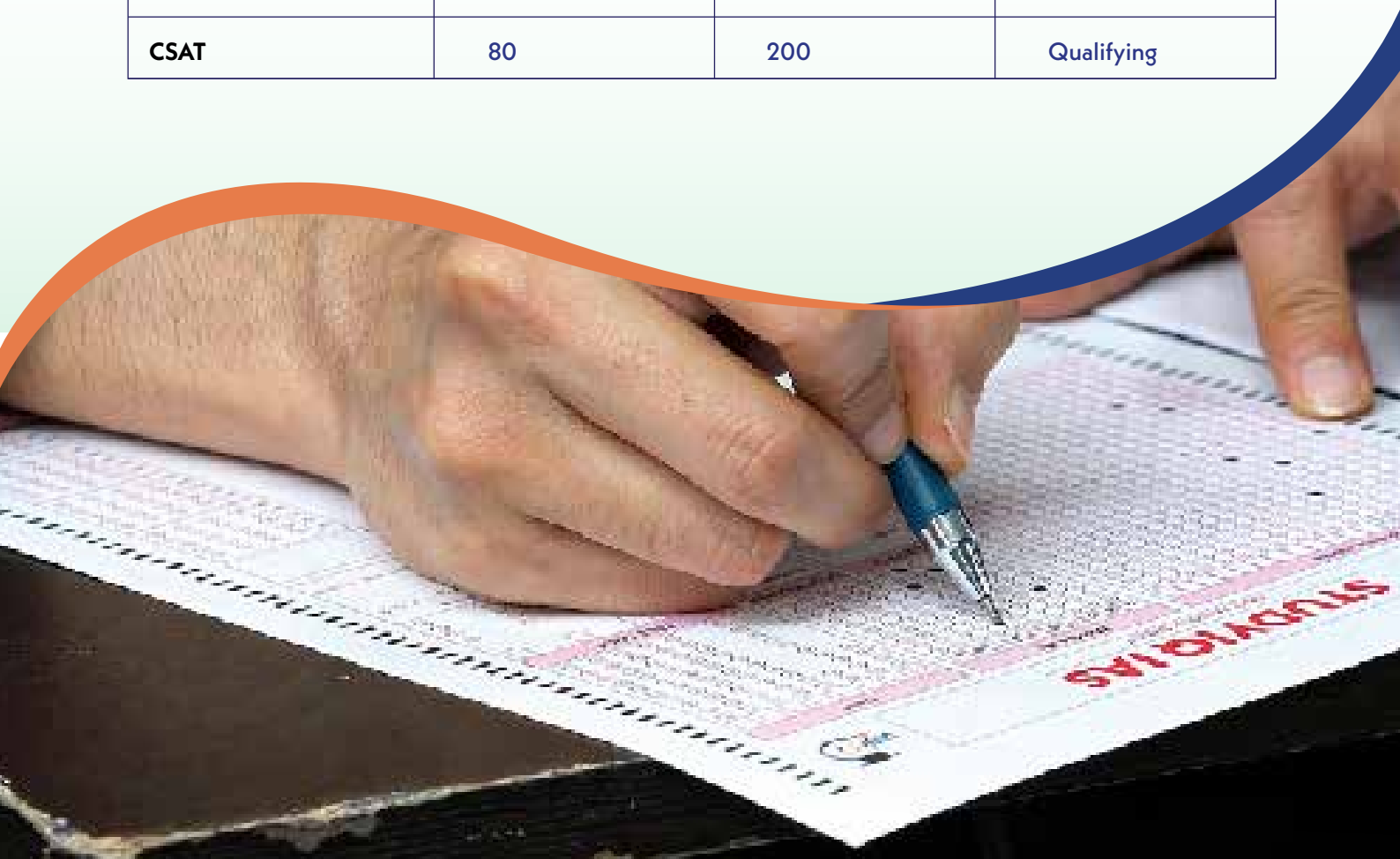
#### Paper 2: CSAT

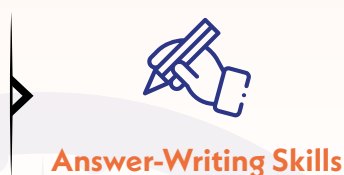
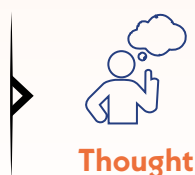


# UPSC MAINS

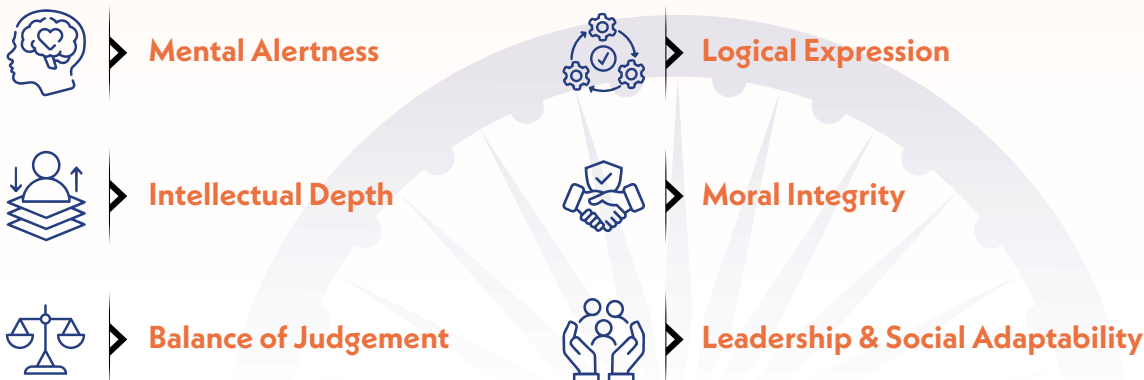
# INTERVIEW
